James Tull '88 was honored by SU for 30 years of service in the Information Technology Department.

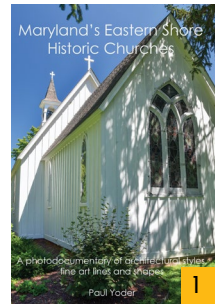
